As we reflect on 2025 — a year in which we proudly celebrated 10 years of giving — we are honored to share the impact we've made together through our commitment to Powering a Brighter Future for our Communities.

This milestone year also marked an important evolution in our work. We engaged our stakeholders to better understand the most urgent needs facing the communities we serve, and we refined our focus to ensure our investments deliver meaningful, lasting impact. Today, our efforts center on four key areas: Community Vitality, Access to Opportunities, Resilience & Sustainability and Education — each designed to strengthen communities and expand opportunity for all.

In 2025, the PPL Foundation contributed more than \$6.5 million to support more than 500 nonprofit organizations. From addressing housing stability, food security and energy assistance, to advancing workforce development and educational pathways, our investments reflect our commitment to meeting essential needs while creating opportunities for long-term success.

We continued to invest in the next generation by providing scholarships to more than 50 students pursuing higher education and careers in trades and technical fields, awarding STEM grants to educators, and supplying essential school materials to more than 2,500 students.

We also responded to urgent needs by helping launch a Critical Support Fund to provide relief to food banks in Pennsylvania and Rhode Island, and by supporting local families through the Good Neighbor Energy Fund — ensuring critical assistance reaches those who need it most.

Equally inspiring is the generosity of our employees and retirees who helped raise a record-setting \$10 million through our annual giving campaign to support nearly 500 nonprofit organizations across four states. Their dedication reflects the spirit of service that defines our company culture.

This report is more than a summary of impact — it's a celebration of partnership, progress and possibility. We are deeply grateful to the nonprofit organizations, community leaders and volunteers who bring this work to life every day.

Empowering Pennsylvania communities

In 2025, the PPL Foundation deepened its commitment to strengthening communities across Pennsylvania, **awarding more than 120 grants to nonprofit organizations** serving residents in 29 counties. These investments reflect a strategic, statewide approach to addressing critical community needs – supporting initiatives that expand access to education, enhance workforce development, promote environmental stewardship and providing essential services to families and individuals. By reaching communities across a broad geographic footprint, the foundation continues to play a vital role in fostering opportunity, resilience and long-term community vitality.

A key highlight of this year's funding is the foundation's focus on growth and inclusion. Approximately **22% of grant recipients were newly funded organizations** in 2025, demonstrating a deliberate effort to broaden partnerships and extend support to additional community-based programs. From helping families manage rising costs to advancing local economic development and expanding educational pathways, PPL Foundation funding empowers nonprofits to deliver critical services where they are needed most.

Operating as the Rhode Island Energy Foundation in the Ocean State, the foundation plays a critical role in strengthening local communities through targeted philanthropic investments. In 2025, the foundation contributed **\$1 million in charitable funding to 40 organizations**, supporting a broad network of nonprofits working to address essential community needs. These investments reflect commitment to improving the quality of lives across Rhode Island by supporting initiatives focused on financial stability, community resilience and access to basic services.

A significant portion of this support includes partnerships with well-established organizations such as the **United Way** and the **Good Neighbor Energy Assistance Fund**, which provide vital resources to individuals and families facing financial hardship. Through these partnerships, the foundation helps ensure that vulnerable populations have access to energy assistance and critical support services, particularly during times of economic strain or extreme weather. This work directly aligns with the Foundation's broader commitment to affordability and customer support.
